Summer school at BLLC is a play-based and inquiry-based program that runs Monday through Thursday, 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Your child will engage in a daily schedule that includes free-choice play, a guided activity, circle time activities, snack, and afternoons that will frequently have us out and about on field trips, hiking, or just doing some general urban spelunking.

You may opt for an earlier day for your child; simply indicate a regular time you would like to pick up. There is no discount for a shortened day, as we have only 10 spaces and our teachers work until 2:00. Field trips are often scheduled in the afternoons, but we will communicate in advance when we have a long-day excursion planned or we are going to leave in the morning. Cost for camps are as follows: \$1,200 (\$1,450 after June 1) for All Summer; \$600 (\$725 after June 1) per 4-week session; or \$195 per week (\$225/wk. if registering after June 1)

**How We Move** explores transportation and how our bodies work. Past transportation activities have included making paper airplanes and exploring flight; putting together roadways inside and out; digging trenches and waterways; exploring the types of machinery needed to do such activities; and visiting the construction site of the Light Rail at McClellan, a tour of the Montlake drawbridge, a tour of the operating room of the Bainbridge Island ferry, and a tour of the Museum of Flight. Past Body Works activities have included setting up a doctor's office; looking at x-rays of frogs and humans; human "structures" and modern dance; large-motor activities and team sports (London Bridge, flag tag, Red Rover, hopscotch, tumbling, jump rope); and a visit by a family physician and an orthopedic doc.

**Garden Party** explores plants, seeds, the growth cycle of flora and fauna found in typical gardens (ladybugs, frogs, butterflies, for example), bugs, worms, and birds, and lessons in conservation and the environment. Activities have included: bird seed feeders out of pinecones; painted pots with Gerbera daisies; making a worm bin and feeding the worms; turning compost; planting flowers in our garden and telling the difference between harmful plants, native plants, and nuisance plants; tea parties in our garden and in local parks; and face painting in the style of plant or bug of your choice.

**Pirates** is a camp celebrating summer. We search for buried treasure, make a "ship" in our garden area and set sail for lands unknown. This year, we shall incorporate our wildly successful tour of the world in our Pirates camp and mark on our maps where we're going and where we've been. Face-painting, mini faux fencing lessons, and storytelling are big parts of this camp.

**Life's a Beach** gets us looking at waterways, watersheds, how they work, and takes us to the wading pools and beaches around our school. Past activities have included: wading pool games, water table watersheds, field trip to Lincoln Park tidal pools, water cab to Alki, sand castles, and popsicle-making.

**CREATE** embodies Culinary activities, Reading activities, Erudition in (eating, education, emotional domains), Art/Acting, Telling stories, and Embodying all that we choose to do. Think well-rounded art school for the early learning set. Past activities have included: an atelier format for art, literature, putting on plays, making a recipe book of yummy things we made together, progressive storytelling while wandering through the woods of Frink Park, picnics, and poetry.
